

Can I send a lithium battery on my own?

No- you are not able to send lithium batteries on their own through domestic or international post.

Can I post lithium batteries?

Here's what they say about posting lithium batteries. You cannot send lithium batteries on their own through domestic or international post. You can send lithium batteries in the UK or international post only when they're contained in a device (except in their Business Response, Freepost, Packetpost and Packetsort services).

Can I ship a lithium battery abroad?

When shipping abroad, lithium batteries must remain inside their associated device. It is not possible to ship lithium batteries separately. Plus, when shipping lithium batteries abroad you must also check the specific rules in the country that you are shipping to. What is the difference between a lithium cell and a lithium battery?

Can I send lithium-ion batteries within the UK?

When exposed to high temperatures, lithium-ion batteries have been known to overheat and even explode. For this reason, we have some restrictions when sending lithium-ion batteries through our network. You can send lithium-ion batteries within the UK, as long as the battery is fitted within the device.

Can I send lithium batteries by air?

There may be an extra charge to send lithium batteries by air, as they have to be handled separately at the airport. You may only send a maximum of 2 lithium batteries (or 4 lithium cells) in one package. You must take all available precautions to stop the device overheating.

Are lithium batteries safe to ship?

In 2013, regulations were introduced by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and the International Air Transport Association (IATA) to make shipping lithium batteries safer. When sending batteries in the post, these shipping restrictions mean that: No damaged batteries can be shipped. Batteries must be packed and labelled correctly.

Was told to erase the "battery" on the content description -- that the staff member had write me when I tried to send it -- and replace it with "lithium battery attached to equipment". For batteries either inside the device or sent separately in the packaging the Watt-hour rating must not exceed 20Wh per cell or 100Wh per lithium-ion /polymer battery. For lithium metal/alloy ...

Effectively, when shipping any lithium batteries you should ensure you adhere to the Dangerous goods regulations. Whilst you can see further specific later in this ...

Yes, you can send a lithium battery or item containing a lithium battery by mail within Australia provided that you make sure that the item is safe to send. Lithium batteries and items containing lithium batteries are dangerous goods and can not be carried by Australia Post by air. Such items will be carried in the mail by road transport only ...
